This course satisfies requirements for the New Supervisor course under Occupations Code §1701.352. This course is designed to educate law enforcement officers and build foundational knowledge to help prepare them for their role as a new supervisor. This course provides new supervisors with the tools they need to foster a positive work environment, drive team performance, and manage the complexities of their new position.

Student Prerequisites:

This course is mandated for peace officers who are appointed or will be appointed to the officer's first supervisory position. They must receive in-service training on

supervision not earlier than the 12th month before the date of that appointment or

later than the first anniversary of the date of that appointment.

This course may be taken by other law enforcement professionals to include telecommunicators and county corrections.

## **Feb. 16 Finding Wellness- Building A Better Life #4202**

**4 Hrs. (1pm-5pm)**

**Instructor(s):** Deputy Alexis Brown

**Registration Deadline:** 2/9/27

This course is designed to teach law enforcement professionals the importance of physical, mental, emotional, and social wellness, and to break down the stigma of mental health in the law enforcement profession. This course is designed to help law enforcement professionals explore the risk factors that impact mental health, learn to recognize conditions and burnout, and identify practical wellness strategies for the demands of the job. This course also addresses how to recognize the signs of suicidal ideation and how to build a suicide prevention plan. Learners will explore how to practice resilience and overcome barriers to become more able to withstand the demands of their lives and chosen careers.

## **Feb. 18-19 Interpersonal Communication in Jail Setting (Intermediate) 3503**

**16 Hrs. (8am-5pm)**

**Instructor(s):** Deputy Shane Threet

**Registration Deadline:** 2/11/27

This course is designed to provide the county corrections officer with an understanding of basic communication skills and the ability to use them. Management of inmate population within a correctional setting has changed in recent years. In the past, staff have been asked to put themselves on the line without all the knowledge and skills they really needed. Staff have had to cope with ever increasing legal, physical, and emotional demands. With the recent development of more in-depth mental health training and de-escalation skills among staff, learning the principles of interpersonal communication is more important than ever. This course is one of the Intermediate Core courses required by TCOLE to receive the Intermediate Certification as a County Corrections Officer.

**Testing/Certification**

The instructor will use oral questioning during the presentation of each module to assess participants' mastery of the material. Problem areas identified during questioning will be reviewed in further detail. The use of scenarios and course activities throughout the course are used to assess participant understanding and application of knowledge and skills obtained throughout the training. Feedback and discussion of responses further allows the instructor to assess mastery of the material.
